DIRECTIVE NO. 19

In exercise of powers conferred under Rule 28 of RPF Rules, 1987 read with section 8 (2) of the Railway Protection Force Act, 1957 (as amended by Act 60 of 1985) the undersigned hereby issues the following directive:-

This directive is issued in supersession of Directive No. 10 issued vide letter of even number dated 27.4.1994.

Subj: Recruitment of Inspectors (Prosecution) in
Grade Rs. 6500-10500/-.

1. Schedule IV of the RPF Rules, 1987 (as in Directive No. 7).
2. The selection for vacancies of Inspectors (Pros.) to be filled up by promotion (as in Directive No. 7).
3. As regards direct recruitment of Inspectors (Pros) it has been decided that the recruitment of these posts will be done on the All India basis by a Central Selection Board which will comprise three Chief Security Commissioners of Zonal Railways and a Superior Officer of the Prosecution Branch. The Board will be nominated by DG/RPF.

There will be a written test and viva-voce for such direct recruitment of Inspector (Pros). 50% marks will be allotted for written test, 30% marks for academic record and experience in legal profession and 20% marks for viva-voce. The written examination will be on Law and Procedure. The minimum qualifying marks would be 60% for Unreserved candidates and 50% for SC/ST and OBC candidates in written test and in aggregate.
